SONGS AND ORAL LANGUAGE DEVELOPMENT

- ▶ Book reading and song fosters language development and bonds between parent and children.
- Songs help children develop their attention span.
- Early exposure to language assists children in understanding the meaning of words.

WHY SONGS AND PUPPETS

- Children at 18 months that have experienced daily interaction with families were found to have stronger productive vocabularies at 24 months.
- ► The relationship between language and vocabulary at two years of age predicts a child's ability at age eight.

SIX PRINCIPLES OF ENVIRONMENTAL FACTORS

- There are six principles that describe environmental factors that encourage language learning, all of which can be activated as children hear books and songs.
- Children need to hear many words often.
- 2. Children learn words when they are interested.
- 3. Children learn best when adults are responsive to them.
- 4. Words are learned when meanings are made clear.
- 5. Vocabulary and grammar are learned together.
- 6. Keep it positive while encouraging conversation with continued dialogue.
