Rhymes and song encourage bonding!

When parents hold, rock and touch their babies as they say rhymes and sing songs, the close physical contact establishes an emotional bond.

Rhymes and songs lead to language development! The strong rhythm of rhymes and songs helps babies absorb the pattern of language. Babies are introduced to a rich vocabulary, and they have the opportunity to learn new words.

Rhymes and action songs also build memory skills, motor skills, and early literacy skills! They inspire creativity, and on top of everything, they're a whole lot of fun!
